### Reflection

In the year 1717, the governor of Sao Paulo, Brazil, with a large entourage was to visit the rural town of Guaratingueta' on his way to an important city. The townspeople anxious to provide a festive meal sent local fishermen to the river Paraiba even though it was not the best season for fishing. The fishermen, Domingos Garcia, Felipe Pedroso e João Alves prayed to the Mother of God to help them in their important mission. They cast their nets from canoes many times with no luck. About to give up, Joao Alves cast again. He caught no fish but found the head of a statue in the net. Curious, he cast again and pulled up the headless statue. The men recognized the image of the Immaculate Conception and with enthusiasm cast again and again, catching as many fish as their canoas could hold.

They cleaned up and repaired the Baroque style terracotta image which remained in the home of Felipe Pedroso for 15 years. His friends and neighbors often came to pray there together. People observed candles mysteriously going out and on again about the statue of Our Lady and more people came to pray.

An oratory was built for the statue of the Immaculate Conception, which came to be known as Our Lady Aparecida. 'Aparecida' means appeared in Portuguese. Soon the oratory was too small, so the pastor of the parish built a chapel for her in 1745.

In 1888, a church was consecrated in her honor. The cloak of Our Lady Aparecida was offered to her the same year by Princess Isabel, on her second visit to the Sanctuary. The robe is rich in meaning. The blue color of the mantle symbolizes heaven. The gold embroidery that adorns the mantle symbolizes royalty and reminds us that Our Lady Aparecida is Queen of Heaven and Earth. The Brazilian flag embroidered on the mantle symbolizes that she is the patron saint of Brazil. The Vatican flag reminds us that the Virgin Mary is Mother of the Church. The united flags of Brazil and the Vatican symbolize that Brazil is a Catholic country, under the protection of Our Lady Aparecida.

Along with the mantle, a gold crown was also offered to Our Lady Aparecida by Princess Isabel, on the same date, November 6, 1888. The crown reminds us of the fifth Glorious Mystery that we pray in the rosary: the coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth.

The Princess also signed a law outlawing slavery that year.

In 1894 the Redemptorist Missionaries arrived to minister to the pilgrims who were arriving in in great numbers. The Redemptorists are still there today offering Mass and celebrating so many Confessions every day.

The church became a minor basilica in 1908 and Pope Pius XI decreed Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception Aparecida, Queen and Patroness of Brazil on July 16, 1930. On the 250th anniversary of the devotion, Pope St. Paul VI offered Our Lady Aparecida a rose of Gold in 1967. Pope Benedict gave her another when he visited in 2007. Due to the color of terracotta the Brazilians affectionately refer to the statue as 'a Moreninha', the little dark Lady.

Among the many miracles attributed to Aparecida, this is a favorite. In mid -1850, a slave named Zacarias, imprisoned by thick chains, as he passed through the Sanctuary, asked the foreman for permission to pray to Our Lady Aparecida. Receiving permission, the slave kneeled and prayed contritely. The chains, miraculously, loosened from his wrists leaving Zacarias free.


# For October, The Month of the Holy Rosary:
