I have wept for my sins; I have detested my tepidness; I am resolute in consoling the Heart of Jesus by attending to perfection". Venerable Pio Bruno Lanteri. How can we attend to perfection?" Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of Heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For My yoke is easy, and My burden light."

Iune is the month of the Sacred Heart. Pope Saint John Paul II dedicated many of his Angelus talks to the litany of the Sacred Heart.

"During the entire month of June, the Church has placed before us the mysteries of the Heart of Jesus, the God-Man. These mysteries are expressed in a penetrating way in the Litany of the Sacred Heart, which can be sung, which can be recited, but above all which ought to be meditated."

Jesus has a human heart, which we contemplate as a symbol of His humanity. He is a Divine person with a human nature. *Heart of Jesus, Son of the Eternal Father,* have mercy on us. As we approach the solemnity of Pentecost consider the role of the 3rd Person of the Holy Trinity as regards the Savior. *Heart of Jesus, formed by* the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, have mercy on us.

Every time we pray the words of the Angelus, we venerate the moment of the Conception beneath the Immaculate Heart. She conceived by the Holy Spirit; the Eternal Word became Flesh and dwells among us. The Logos, the Word of God became an embryo in a Virgin of Nazareth, and nobody knew the long-awaited Messiah had arrived except Mary. It was her secret. Every time we pray the Angelus or just the Hail Mary, we proclaim that secret, we celebrate that moment, we thank the Blessed Trinity for a Savior, we adore the God-Man, Jesus, Son of Mary, and the Image of the Invisible God.

The Sacred Heart is often depicted in Christian art as a flaming heart shining with divine light, wounded and bleeding, surrounded by a crown of thorns, surmounted by a cross. Sometimes Jesus, with his wounded hands, points at the Heart. The wounds and crown of thorns allude to the manner of Jesus' death, while the fire represents His love. Why do we worship His Heart? The heart represents the whole person. The heart is the symbol of the source of all our sentiments, intellectual power, will and conscience.

To adore the Sacred Heart is to adore Christ, true God, and true man. The Human Heart reminds us that Jesus was subject to all the feeling that **we** experience except sinfulness. He felt joy and sadness, acceptance, and rejection, even desolation in His Agony. Venerable Pio Bruno Lanteri said, "I am resolute in consoling the Heart of Jesus by attending to perfection". How can we console Our Lord Who is in Glory? He Himself taught, "YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND." and "YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF." WHAT-SO-EVER YOU DO TO THE LEAST OF MY BRETHER, THAT YOU DO UNTO ME."

Rest in Peace Fr. Vincenzo Antolini, OMV

It is with sadness that we must report the passing of our Father Vincenzo Antolini. OMV, who was active at the Chapel in the 2000's.



Fr. Vinnie arrived in Boston in the mid seventies to found the first Oblate house in the United

States. He brought with him enthusiasm, black hair and a heavy Roman accent with little English to go with it. When he assumed charge of St. Clement Shrine much of the complex had been vacant and unmaintained. Despite there being no heat there were rats aplenty. He, Fr. David Beauregard, Fr. Larry Darnell and Br. Luigi Falbo spent spent their waking hours dressed for winter weather while indoors.

Father Vincenzo famously walked to the motherhouse of the Daughters of St. Paul during the blizzard of 1978 so that he could offer Mass for the sisters. As Fr. Vinnie's English improved he wasn't able to shake free from speech habits that he had learned as a native Roman. He acquired as a boy a poetic way of speaking called Romanace. No one is ever at fault for anything so events are referenced in oblique terms. This makes native Romans valued in the field of diplomacy. I heard Fr. V. use this way of speaking when he said," When you chase the pen." No one is at fault for clumsily dropping a pen.

He was a man of prayer and the fruit of that good habit would come out in his preaching. I had occasion to ride with Fr. Vinnie as we headed in to the chapel from Milton. He had promised some teaching sisters in Hyde Park that he would stop and offer Mass for them very early that morning. As it would happen the Gospel for that day was, The Mustard Seed. Father's concise homily ran like this; I don't think that I will ever forget it." Sisters, that seed is love, and it is planted in your hearts. The birds that come are your students and they rest in the branches of that love." Rest in peace our brother Vincenzo. We are poorer for the lack of you. Pray for us
